# Drives

## FIGHT DRIVE

Does anyone really want our dogs to have fight drive? Well, that depends on what you want to do with your dog. Do you want a dog that comes like a bullet on the recall or like a slug? Will your dog allow you to grind or cut his nails? Will your dog stay in an ex-pen or crate with the door left open. All of these behaviors are effected by how much fight drive our dogs have. You can do many things with your dogs to raise fight drive including playing tug of war games, roughing them up and wrestling with them, or poke and chase games. So what if your dog is over the top with fight drive and might make a great police dog? You have to do lots of timeouts, handle them with calm and firm hands and teach settle exercises. Frustration will show up in a dog with high fight drive with fence fighting, grabbing, growling, gripping items and not releasing them.

How we deal with the dog we have goes back to the relationship we have with them. Every one of your interactions with your dog is one that the dog takes seriously. In a world where it sometimes seems that there is never enough time, dogs remind us to live for the moment.

Hope you have enjoyed the articles on drives. I will continue submitting articles about training, leadership etc. if there is an interest. I just finished my 18th CD on a dog, mostly Irish Setters, but also my beloved Shelties Fancy and Templeton as well as a Pembroke Welsh Corgi and a Smooth Fox Terrier. ### Tamiflu as a treatment for Parvo

It is being reported around the internet that the drug Tamiflu, which is used to treat the flu virus in humans, is being used successfully to treat Parvo in dogs. One such report tells of an eight week old redbone puppy who was diagnosed with Parvo on a Monday evening. She came to the vet vomiting and was getting very weak and lethargic. She was given her first dose of Tamiflu orally on Monday night. By Tuesday about noon an IV was placed and she was given fluids as supportive therapy, along with antibiotics and medicine to help her stop vomiting. She never vomited after the first dose of Tamiflu, and had only one episode of diarrhea on Tuesday morning. By Wednesday she was able to take water and a small amount of a bland diet. She was able to keep that down and her next bowel movement was mostly solid and with no blood. Within 36 hours of her first dose of Tamiflu she was running around wanting to play. Within 48 hours she was back to her old self. According to the reports the treatment is working very well with near 100% cure rate within about 2-3 days. Tamiflu needs to be started early for it to work well.

According to another report, although most vets are now giving standard parvo care with Tamiflu, the studies are showing that dogs are able to recover with only Tamiflu at home. The expense to care for a dog with Parvo is much less and the cure rate much higher with the use of this drug. Maybe someday Parvo won't be a disease that causes as much fear as it does now.

If you have a puppy or dog develop Parvo be sure to talk to your vet about this possible new treatment.
