Three Inches

Tomorrow on their six-week "birthday," the puppies in our newest Sheltie litter will take turns standing on the grooming table for their first official measurements. We've been evaluating this litter informally since birth—head detail, eye shape, length of hock, tailset, angulation, temperament. And now size.

But size is not just another trait. It's one for which our standard mandates a narrow three-inch range, beyond which a dog is disqualified from breed-ring competition. Tomorrow's measurements, and those of the next few weeks, will determine which of several promising puppies will be "grown out" as show prospects and which will go as pets. Already, my experienced eye tells me that one puppy is definitely heading oversize and another will likely be too small.

A variety of breeds, from Collies to toys, contributed to the Sheltie gene pool. As a result, size—particularly oversize—continues to be a major challenge to breeders. Height is a polygenetic (multi-gene) trait of moderate to high heritability, which means it should respond to direct selection. But are breeders really practicing direct selection for size? And what does "direct selection" actually mean?

Direct selection for size should mean choosing breeding animals only from within the range of allowable heights—in particular, not breeding oversize bitches. A hallmark of polygenetic traits is their susceptibility to environmental influences, and an individual's sex is a primary environmental influence on adult size. Identical "size genes" will produce more size in an environment of male hormones than in an environment of female hormones. This means that male and female Shelties with the same "size genes" will likely have adult heights differing by a half-inch or more, with males being taller. Breeders are much more likely to breed from a non-finished, or non-finishable, bitch than dog, but we thwart our best size-control efforts with every "otherwise lovely" 16-and-a-half-inch brood bitch, who is, at a minimum, the genetic equivalent of a 17-inch male.

Direct selection for size should mean choosing breeding animals that run the full gamut of allowable heights. Thanks to the science of population genetics, we know that polygenetic traits are "normal distributed" around a "population mean." This means that if we were to plot heights for the entire Sheltie population, we would end up with a bell-shaped graph with a high midpoint representing the population's average, or mean, height. Ninety-six percent of the population will have heights within a relatively small area stretching from just below to just above the mean—for Shelties, probably a three- to four-inch range.

From a practical standpoint, this means that if we want most adult Shelties to measure between 13 and 16-inches, the average height of our breeding population should be 14-and-a-half inches. Unfortunately, the true average is probably at least an inch taller. Rarely does one breed a bitch under 14-and-a-half inches, and the vast majority of stud dogs are over 15 inches.

Our breeding decisions are at least partially influenced by what is winning, and this means judges could play a big part in helping us do more to control size. Wicketing dogs that appear oversize is an excellent start, but it's only a start. If we breeders should use the full allowable height range, judges should choose winners from the full range as

well.

Our standard does not specify an ideal size, nor does it differentiate between the heights of dogs and bitches. Dogs must appear masculine, bitches feminine, but all else being equal, a 14-inch male is as correct as one measuring two

inches taller. Breeders need to keep and breed good small Shelties—especially smaller males, who have "smaller size genes" than identically sized bitches—but that won't happen until breed judges put aside their own preferences

and start giving equal consideration to correct dogs of every allowable size.

Why Dogs Bite Kids

Territorial behavior, anxiety and other medical issues lead dogs to bite children, a new study shows.

To see if there were any common links among <u>dogs</u> who had bitten a child within a particular four-year period, researchers examined 111 cases of dog bites by 103 dogs, all referred to the same veterinary behavior clinic in Philadelphia. They found several distinctive behavior patterns that related to the dogs' territorial behaviors, and suggested that these were the main causes of aggression in dogs:

- Young children (under 6 years) were more likely to be bitten when a dog felt the kids were threatening to take the dogs' food or toys.
- Older children were bitten when the dog felt the kids were encroaching on its territory.
- Children familiar to the dog were more likely to be bitten while the dog was guarding its food.

Unfamiliar children were more likely to be bitten while the dog was protecting its territory.

These behaviors were seen in many different breeds of dogs. (A total of 41 breeds were represented in the study.)

Three quarters of the biter dogs studied exhibited anxiety, either by being left by their owners or being exposed to some <u>loud</u> <u>noise</u>, such as a thunderstorm or fireworks. Young children in particular tend to be noisy and make unpredictable movements, which could frighten an already anxious dog and cause them to bite the child, the researchers said.

Half of the dogs also had medical conditions, such as eye problems, liver and kidney disease, and diseases that affected their bones and skin. Study leader Illana Reisner of the University of Pennsylvania and her colleagues suggest that pain from these conditions could have pushed the dogs over the edge, causing them to bite.

The study's results are detailed in a recent issue of the journal *Injury Prevention*. .

I Have A Question

"What type of grooming equipment (brushes, shampoos, etc...) do you suggest to your <u>companion</u> puppy buyers?"

This is easy...........A pin brush and show them one of mine, I like the Vellus mid size but depends on the persons hand what they should use. A slicker brush and a comb...If they want to trim I have them get the thinning shears the small ones, cant do that much damage. Show them how to cut nails and what kind of clippers to get. Shampoo's, usually something like Bio groom but always telling them to use doggie shampoo not human.

Barbara

A good pin brush and a pair of nail clippers with Quick Stop is a must. I use mane and tail shampoo sold in any Smith's can be diluted and I add a touch of Dawn dish soap if they are very dirty.

I always suggest a slicker, metal comb and pin brush. A spray bottle to mist with. Toe nail trimmers.

For shampoo, I like the Oatmeal shampoo that you can buy at Walmart. I believe it is made by Hartz. Good shampoo and not that expensive. Shannalee



I recommend that everyone have a good comb (with wide and a bit narrower teeth), a pin brush, a slicker brush and a poodle comb. Poodle combs are great for when a sheltie is blowing coat. And a spray bottle for misting when you brush your dog. You also need nail clippers and/or a Dremel (grinder) for doing nails. Shampoos, depends on where they want to get them. The ones I really like come from dog show vendors. For buying local Maine and Tail works well for dogs too and you can get it at Wal Mart. Peggy

RECIPE OF THE MONTH:

Breath Bustin' Biscuits

ingredients

- 1 1/2 cups whole wheat flour
- 1 1/2 cups Bisquick® baking mix
- 1/2 cup mint leaves -- loosely packed
- 1/4 cup milk
- 4 tablespoons margarine
- 1 egg
- 1 1/2 tablespoons maple syrup -- or corn syrup

directions

Combine all ingredients in food processor, process until well mixed, mint is chopped, and a large ball forms. Press or roll on non-stick surface (floured board or ceramic) to a thickness of 1/4-1/2". Cut into 1x2" strips or with bone-shaped cookie cutter and place on non-stick cookie pan. Bake at 375° for 20 minutes or until lightly browned.

Cool and store in air-tight container.

Makes about 30 medium biscuits.
