Member Spotlight

Getting to know our Members:

State your full name(s): *Tricia Harris*

- 2) Kennel name and how you came up with it: *Lacewood Shelties; I originally bred under the kennel name of Silvertip shelties. I lived on Silvertip lane and bred AOAC's so it seemed appropriate. When I got married, my husband did not feel like he was a part of Silvertip Shelties and he wanted to be included in the dogs at first. I was out of dogs for several years and when we got back in to dogs we started to look for a kennel name. My husband loves to do woodworking and was working with a lot of exotic woods at the time. We thought about different names of exotic woods, when Lacewood came up I loved it. It had the feminine flare that I wanted but was associated with his love of wood. Just before we picked Lacewood as our kennel name, we got a Maltese that we named Lacey, it all kind of fit into place. I still like Silvertip though!!*
- 3) How did you first become interested in shelties? *I graduated from nurses training and moved to Midway Utah. My roommate in Midway wanted to get a Sheltie. I had never heard of the breed before that. When she explained to me that they were miniature collies I was hooked. I had always loved collies having grown up when Lassie was popular. When we both went to find dogs, I bought a sheltie and she bought a Lhasa Apso. A couple of years after getting that first sheltie I saw an ad in the newspaper for a "rare white" sheltie. It turned out to be a color headed white that was a blue merle. I was always looking for rare so I bought her. She was a High Born Granddaughter. That started me to become interested in the show ring.*
- 4) Who was your first sheltie and what color was he/she? *My very first Sheltie was a little pet Sable and White sheltie. She was darling. I named her Dusty. She was very smart and beautiful in my eyes. She surely would not have ever made it in the show ring today, but I loved her dearly. The first dog of good breeding was my Color headed white, Misty, she was sired by Beverly Danvers Champion High Born son, Shadow. Misty is the dog that started my quest to find better and better dogs.*
- 5) Do you breed shelties? What lines do you breed? *Most of the breedings that I do are AOACs. They would go back to Banchory lines.*
- 6) Who was/is your mentor, Who do we thank for getting you started? *In the beginning Bev Danvers got me started wanting to show dogs. I started to train and show my dogs in obedience to begin with. Many of the obedience people of the day were also showing in conformation. Pretty much the entire sheltie club back then were also members of the Obedience club. Showing in obedience really got me excited to try the conformation ring. It is hard to go from one to the other and I spent a lot of years shipping bitches to really nice boys trying to improve my lines so that I could have a dog nice enough for the show ring.*
- 7) How many dogs do you have? What titles do your dogs have? *I trained my second sheltie to a UDX. Misty, the blue color headed white was trained for her CDX. My sable male, Brock has his CD. I have 3 champions at my house right now. 2 of those are homebred champions and one has a BISS.*
- 8) Who is your favorite dog (that you own)? *Oh that is like asking who my favorite child is. It depends on the day. I just adore them all. I'm glad I have low enough numbers to get personally involved with each one of them. I love them all for different reasons. They have personalities as varied as humans have. Notes on Teeth

Dental Formula

Welcome to the Clan Duncan Breeder's Notebook. All of us wear many "hats" as we travel through life. Here in the Breeder's Notebook, I put on two of my professional "hats," those of biologist and scientific illustrator, to bring you thoughts and perspectives from my own personal vision of the Sheltie. These pages are offered in a spirit of inquiry and with a desire to share.

On the first page of the Breeder's Notebook, I offer a look at Sheltie teeth, their functions, and where they are located in the skull.

Our breed, happily, has a "dog-shaped" skull. By this I mean that no gross distortions of the basic canid skull plan are required by the AKC Sheltie Standard. I have examined thousands of coyote skulls and perhaps ten Sheltie skulls. In some cases the skulls of coyote and Sheltie were so similar that it was quite difficult to distinguish one from the other until I looked at the teeth. (Sheltie teeth tend to be smaller. Also, of course, in a Sheltie of excellent breed type, the backskull will be narrower and flatter than that of a coyote, and the zygomatic arches more flattened.) Having a basic dog-shaped skull is good. This means that Sheltie teeth need not be crowded, misaligned, or otherwise adversely affected as we strive for perfection in breed type.

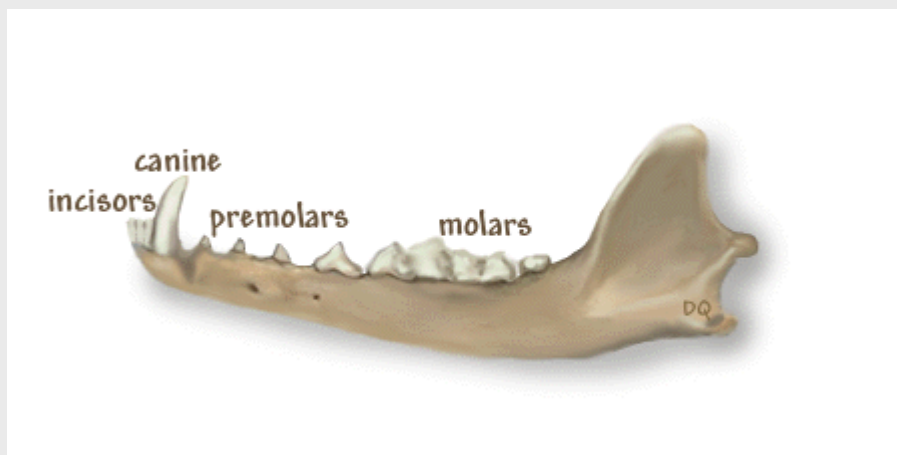
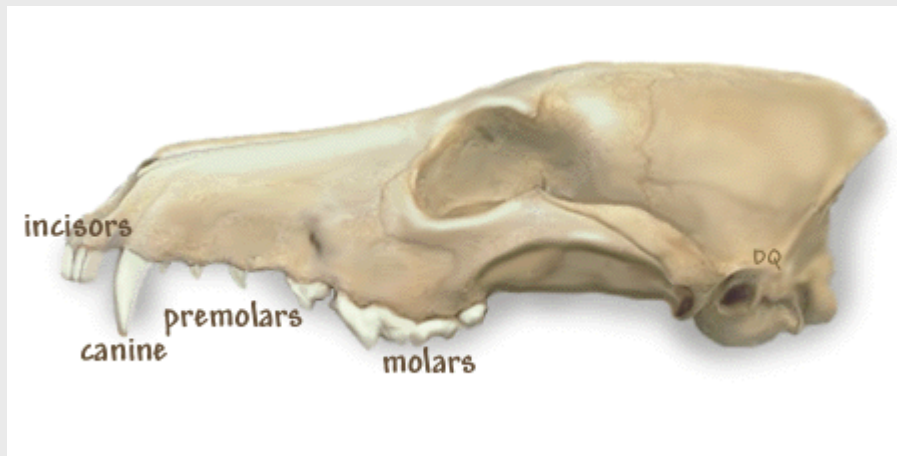


Let's look at a Sheltie skull. Remember, the teeth appear to be larger and longer in a skull than in a live dog, since the gums are not present.

Notes on Teeth

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A domestic dog, *Canis familiaris*, typically has on each side of each jaw the following teeth: three incisors, one canine, four premolars, and two or three molars. Incisors are used for biting and cutting, canines for stabbing and grasping, premolars for holding, and

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molars for crushing and tearing.



Characteristics that take away from the utility of a structure are called "degenerate characteristics." As a breed Shelties have few degenerate characteristics, compared to many other breeds. For the health of our breed and of our beloved individual Shelties, this is an excellent state of affairs. One degenerate characteristic sometimes seen in Shelties is missing teeth. Of course, a wild canid with missing teeth might be at a disadvantage when capturing and eating prey, so this is not good. In Shelties, the teeth most often found missing are premolars. Also, in many Shelties with full dentition, the first two premolars have been reduced to tiny points of enamel, barely visible above the gums. Having a missing tooth or two will not affect the health of an individual Sheltie, but as a general rule, I suggest that breeders may wish to avoid mating two dogs that have missing teeth, and should watch carefully that teeth in their bloodlines are not being reduced in size to the point where they become invisible or absent.

I Have a Question



This Month's Question:

What brand of dog food do you feed and what ingredients do you look for or stay away from?

I feed Purina One Salmon for sensitive stomachs. Although my dogs do not have sensitive stomachs.

I really like this food. My dog's weight is easy to maintain and I can switch any dog to it without getting diarrhea, even if I do not switch them slowly over as we are supposed to. — Diane Orr, Windabrae Shelties

I feed Exceed, Chicken and Rice. I purchase it at Sam's club.

I really like the food. I have had the most consistency with it overall. I have tried just about all foods and most all do well. I think there should be a balance of protein to carbohydrates in food and the "Exceed" seems to achieve that well.

I do stay away from lamb as a protein source. I just haven't had good luck with it versus the chicken.

I don't feed puppy food and wean my babies right over to this food.

This is interesting timing for this question. I have been feeding Pro Plan for a long time with good results. About the time they came out with the new formula for Pro Plan I started to have problems with my dogs. I am not seeing as nice of coats, the dogs were losing weight and I noticed diarrhea and occasional vomiting. I saw on the shelties lists where others were experiencing the same kinds of symptoms with the new formula. I have now switched my dogs to the Pro Plan Performance which is just a couple of dollars more expensive than the regular Pro Plan and I have found these symptoms to be disappearing. I understand that Pro Plan is planning to bring back their original formula. I will probably stay with the performance for now. — Tricia Harris, Lacewood Shelties

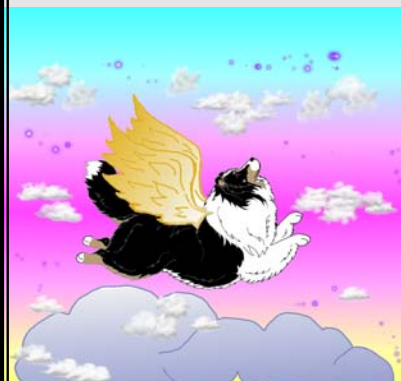

Meat Balls

take 4 lbs ground meat...Buffalo, turkey, beef, or chicken
1 lb liver ground up.....(beef or chicken, turkey)
2 c. powder milk
4 eggs
Optional:
2 TBS parsley, or 1 tsp garlic.
1/2 lb. ground tallow.

mix well (this is a sticky mess)

If too sticky to form .. Add bone meal
or if your dogs can have it (ground brown rice)
Form into balls or strips.
Dehydrate for about three days
place in air tight containers.

These balls work great as a training treat as well.
You can roll dogs supplement tabs in side the balls before you dehydrate them..
