Puppy Uniform Protection and Safety Act

There are animal welfare groups very concerned about the Federal PUPS bill (Puppy Uniform Protection and Safety Act). See:

If we push on it too much now we could accidentally supply grist for the HSUS mill and enable it to get traction. It's always a possibility that it could get attached in the middle of the night to another bill and no amount of strategy can stop that sort of inside deal.

The NAIA has as alert written and ready to fire off to everyone if things heat up. It's expected that they'll push the bill next year. Meantime the NAIA doesn't want to use up the energy of the grassroots people. They can only get rallied so many times before getting tired. Quote from the NAIA: "we don't like to use up people unnecessarily. It's hard to get them back when they're really necessary
